### A Guiding Light in South Dade: MUJER's 2019 Year in Review

As MUJER celebrates another year of services for women, children and families in South Dade, we are grateful for the trust and support we have enjoyed throughout the year from our family of donors and partners.

Our main goals for 2019 have been to strengthen MUJER by constantly improving services, forming partnerships and securing additional resources in order to respond adequately to the emerging needs resulting from domestic violence and sexual assault.

**Serving Our Community.** This past year MUJER took action to fulfill a critical need for transitional housing for women and their families, who became homeless after seeking help and protection from sexual abuse and partner violence. The Office of Violence Against Women awarded MUJER a grant in recognition of our outstanding work in this area.

MUJER's efforts for **Sustaining Our Momentum** is led by the board of directors and a complementary group of supporters, FRIENDS of MUJER. Through consultation, recruitment and cooperation, FRIENDS OF MUJER aims to increase private funding and guarantee MUJER's long term sustainability. Thus far, a total of 55 friends have joined this effort. Our goal is to reach at least 100 friends which would yield \$40,000 of much needed unrestricted funds.

**Maintaining Partnerships.** MUJER, continues to expand and maintain partnerships with other community members and organizations. In 2019, MUJER, together with the office of Commissioner Daniella Levine Cava, who provided \$2,000, embarked upon a campaign to ensure that all members of our community are counted by the 2020 Census, especially the hard to reach undocumented immigrant segment of our population. The highest possible participation in the 2020 Census Count will influence the amount of federal funds earmarked for our community's needs.

The 2019 Annual Report highlights the services, activities and funding sources that make it possible for MUJER to remains loyal to its mission and to continue to be a beacon of hope, encouragement and renewal to all seeking relief from domestic and sexual violence.

FRIENDS OF MUJER is composed of women and men who share the philosophy and mission of MUJER and who will promote the organization by participating in fund raising events in order to ensure its sustainability and the services it provides to the community. Eventually, the goal of Friends of MUJER is to include up to 100 friends and to raise \$40,000 annually in unrestricted funds.

MUJER continues to raise funds through GIVE MIAMI DAY sponsored by the Miami Foundation. This wonderful day of giving calls on all of us to step up and donate to help our community improve the lives of its citizens.



#### Looking Forward to MUJER's Plans for 2020

In early March 2020, just as the 2019 Annual Report was being finalized, the Miami-Dade County government declared an emergency due to the Coronavirus Pandemic. The order mandated all citizens to stay at home from work to avoid becoming infected with the COVID-19 virus. Understandably, the pandemic emergency required MUJER to extensively revise its operating plans while this emergency was in effect

MUJER met this challenge by upgrading its virtual technology capacity to serve its clients while safeguarding the health and well-being of both clients and staff. In addition to working remotely, MUJER secured personal protective equipment from the AIDS Health Care Foundation for distribution to the immigrant community, as well as using a \$100,000 grant from United Way's Pandemic Fund for rent and food assistance to the most defenseless in the community. Looking forward, we realistically anticipate that our future plans must include living and working with Conovid-19 for the remainder of 2020 and possibly well into 2021. We are confident MUJER's Board and Staff will continue to provide crucial leadership in identifying and addressing the critical needs of the community. MUJER will continue to give priority to victims of domestic and sexual violence, the safety and well-being of the women, children, and families it serves.


#### Service partners
